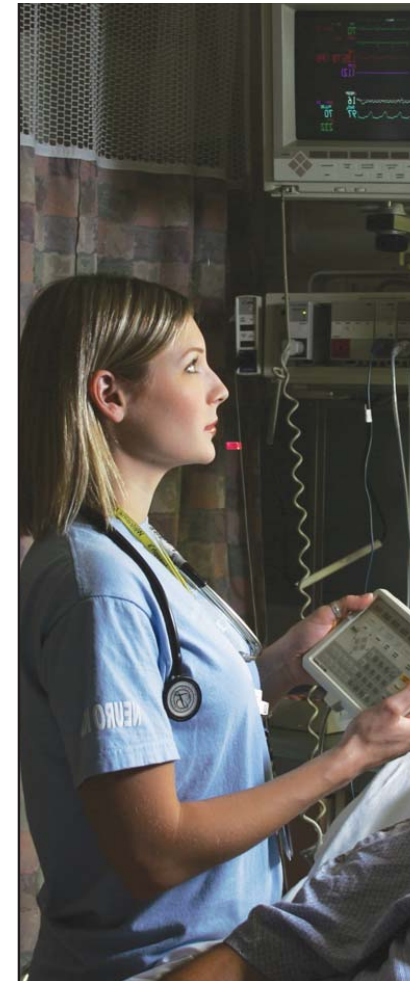
AzNA Membership Dues Information

Annual membership dues in the Arizona Nurses Association (AzNA) include membership in the American Nurses Association (ANA) and the local chapter. AzNA dues are not deductible as a charitable contribution for tax purposes, but may be deductible as a business expense. The percentage of dues used for lobbying is not deductible as a business expense. Contact AzNA for the current non-deductible percentage of dues.

AzNA Membership Categories

- M Full Membership Dues – Employed full or part time.
- R Reduced Membership Dues – Not employed; full-time student; new graduate from basic nursing education program-first membership year only, within six months of graduation; or 62 years or over and not earning more than Social Security System allows.
- S Special Membership Dues – 62 years or over and not employed, or totally disabled.

Greater Phoenix Area Chapter (GPAC)

Chapter 1 (GPAC) supports many community programs and hosts quarterly coffee meetings featuring a variety of speakers. GPAC also offers two programs annually that offer continuing education contact hours.

Tucson
